The Children's Forest movement empowers our children to engage in meaningful action in the face of climate change, and supports them to activate the gifts of positive envisioning and future generational thinking.

Planting native trees is a vital response to climate change. Trees are integral to the health of our planet: they give us clean air, healthy soil, and food, they stabilise our weather systems and sequester carbon. The importance of our relationship with trees for the health of the planet is more fundamental than we can imagine.

The Children's Forest Process:

1. EXPERIENCING

Children are given experiences of meaningful connection with nature through Forest School.

2. IMAGINING

These children are then supported to engage their imagination and creativity as they envision a positive future through art, story, song and crafts.

3. PLANTING

As they plant the trees to create their Children's Forest, the children plant their wishes for a bright future for all life.

4. TENDING

These trees are tended and care-taken by the children over the years to come, supported by their families and communities.
