Workshop Title - Recycle Pallets and Fencing into 'Den-Houses'

Description - Many schools I work in don't have woodland or even trees. To create an environment the children want to explore nature and the surrounding school grounds I often build 'Den-Houses' with them. This provides us with a base from which to explore the surrounding school grounds but also gives the children a very personal reason for engaging in the Forest School process. They love the sense of building something that is their own and once we've completed the basic shell they personalise it with features, doors, windows, furniture, ornaments, objects, decoration, anything they can find to make it theirs. The children always work in pairs throughout the process to encourage teamwork and for space. The 'Den-Houses' can form part a log-circle effect around the fire or be part of a den-building area. The 'Den-Houses' are made from Euro-pallets, which often don't get recycled or re-used by companies, such as Amazon. Because they are slightly smaller than British pallets they get discarded or thrown on the fire. Each 'Den-House' uses about 4 Euro pallets and a recycled fence panel. Old fence panels are also burnt or taken to the tip. Once dismantled the 'slates' of the fence panels make great sides and roofs of the 'Den-Houses'. Skills involved in building the 'Den-Houses' include using a hammer and saw. Co-operation and problem solving. Imagination and planning and lots of fun. The children have a huge amount of motivation to make them, enjoy the process and have a real sense of achievement having completed them. They often become an ongoing project that gets changed and adapted by the children and they evolve into camouflage bases, fairy houses and most recently the Teachers' Rest. The base of the 'Den-Houses' are 3 pallets staked onto each other and these become adapted into a hedgehog house, mini-beast house or some other refuse for creatures or bugs the children would like to protect/help.

Workshop Title - Cooking in the Outdoors

Description - This is a hands-on workshop the aim is to give people confidence to cook with young people in the outdoors. The recipes are suitable for all ages and all dietary requirements. The participants will leave with the skills to make a 3-course meal using both the campfire and camping stoves. We will talk about the equipment needed for cooking with groups of students and the most economical/environmentally friendly way of sourcing them. The emphasis will be on simple dishes that can be scaled up or down as necessary and can be easily adapted to suit any dietary requirements.

We will discuss the benefits of eating together and the satisfaction of eating a meal that you have cooked from scratch. These benefits are both physical and emotional, as teaching children how to

cook and what to cook is a fundamental life skill that they can take from forest school and use for the rest of their lives.

At the end of the workshop, we will eat the food they have made.

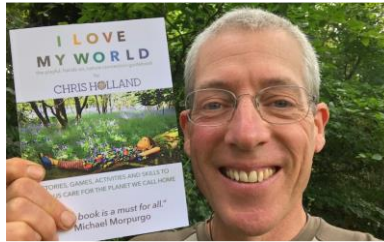


Workshop Title - Storytelling for the Terrified
